

“Makes me Happy” worksheet is a follow up to a warm up game I often play. It’s highly adaptable and works from Shougakko upwards.

It’s a relay game and works well in a Japanese classroom situation.

The students are already in rows so just number each one to six.

Then divide up the board into six columns.

Explain that it’s a drawing game and that today they will all be Picasso-chan.

Students at the front of each of the six rows stand and give each a chalk.

Tell them that at the word “Go”, they will run to the blackboard and can draw whatever they want.

Then they pass the chalk to the second person in each of their rows and so it continues for 3- five minutes.

Rules:

Only one of each picture.

Then, I ask them to make lunch groups and to make a list in English of the pictures that they have drawn, marking the number of their team on it.

After ten or so minutes, collect these sheets and then redistribute them to each of the other teams.

With the attached worksheet (or whatever worksheet you choose to use), get the students to make appropriate sentences from the list of words they have before them.

Usually five is enough.

They can swap to correct.
